

CALIFORNIA-15 TERM LIMITS POLL: EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

US Term Limits survey conducted May 19 through May 20, 2022 by RMG Research Group. 500 likely 2022 Primary voters of CA-15 participated in the survey.

.A majority (80%) of the voters favor an amendment to the U.S. Constitution that will place term limits on U.S. Senators and U.S. House Representatives. Voters also say that they would be more likely to vote for someone who signed the U.S. Term Limits pledge and that they're more likely to support state lawmakers who help advance congressional term limits.

Methodology

The survey of 500 Likely Primary Voters was conducted for USTL on May 19-20, 2022. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by gender, age, and race. Likely voters were determined by a screening process within the survey.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 4.5 percentage points.
