Nebraska Businessman Stars in New Video for U.S. Term Limits

Palm Beach, FL – U.S. Term Limits, the nation’s oldest and largest term limits advocacy group, has released a new [video](#) starring Nebraska businessman and activist John “Buzz” Garlock, who – while holding his granddaughter Harper Lynn on his lap -- makes a pitch for a constitutional amendment to limit congressional terms.

“The remedy for what ails Congress is an infusion of fresh faces and ideas,” Garlock says on camera. “Citizens from all walks of life serving because they believe in America, not because they want a permanent career.”

An Omaha-based investment advisor who was honored by the President for his volunteer service, Garlock explains that he backs term limits in order to hand down the best possible country to future generations. He believes this is best achieved by reducing opportunism in Washington, D.C. and restoring a citizen legislature.

U.S. Term Limits President Philip Blumel praised Garlock for getting involved, stating “We’re honored that Buzz has committed himself to this effort, and in doing so set an example for many Americans who want term limits on Congress, but need assurance that it can really be done.”

According to recent Gallup polling, 75 percent of Americans support term limits on Congress. That figure includes 82 percent of Republicans, 79 percent of Independents and 65 percent of Democrats. But as Garlock describes in the video, it can only happen through constitutional amendment, which begins with a congressional vote.

The U.S. Term Limits strategy involves asking House and Senate candidates to sign a pledge committing support for an amendment limiting Congress to three terms in the House and two in the Senate. This way, they cannot wriggle out of support for the proposal after getting to Washington. So far, it has worked, with over 40 co-sponsors of the amendment bill expected in Congress by January’s inauguration.
