### **U.S. Term Limits Praises Richard Moss for Signing Term Limits Pledge**

Washington, D.C. – U.S. Term Limits (USTL), the leader in the national movement to limit terms for elected officials, today praised Indiana U.S. House candidate Richard Moss (District 8) for signing its congressional term limits pledge.

In November of last year, 14 new U.S. Term Limits pledge signers were elected to Congress – including five new U.S. Senators.

USTL President Philip Blumel commented on Moss' pledge, saying, "We applaud Richard Moss for having the courage to stand with the everyday Americans by standing up to career politicians and special interest groups that run D.C. We need more people who see the problems that career politicians are creating for everyday Americans. We need someone who is willing to work against that system that creates entrenched incumbents. This current system is being propped up by insiders that work for their own self-interest more than the interest of their constituents, and Moss is willing to stand against this system that has become so corrupt."

The U.S. Term Limits Amendment Pledge is provided to every announced candidate for federal office. It reads, "I pledge that as a member of Congress I will cosponsor and vote for the U.S. Term Limits amendment of three (3) House terms and two (2) Senate terms and no longer limit."

The U.S. Term Limits Constitutional Amendment has been introduced in both the U.S. Senate by Senator David Vitter (R-LA) and the House of Representatives by Representative Matt Salmon (R-AZ).

Blumel noted, "This is a critical time in American history. It is vital that we have members of Congress who are willing to work hard and represent the people, not special interest groups. We need members of Congress in D.C. not to line their own pockets and pad their investment portfolios, but who create jobs and boost the economy. Stopping career politicians might not solve all the issues that America faces today but it will make a big impact. Richard Moss knows that, and is willing to fight for this necessary change to our system of governance."

According to the last nationwide [poll](#) on term limits conducted by Gallup, the issue enjoys wide bipartisan support. The poll showed that 75% of Americans support congressional term limits.

Gallup's analysis states, "Republicans and independents are slightly more likely than Democrats to favor term limits; nevertheless, the vast majority of all party groups agree on the issue. Further, Gallup finds no generational differences in support for the proposal."

Blumel concluded, "Everyday American's are living pay check to pay check, while career politicians become multimillionaires while on a salary of less than \$180,000 per year. It is time to limit their



terms and return control of our nation to people who have actually had to create a job, earn an honest paycheck and pay a mortgage. It is time for a constitutional amendment limiting congressional terms.”

The term limits amendment bills would require a two-thirds majority in the House and Senate, and ratification by 38 states in order to become part of the constitution.
