U.S. Term Limits Praises Bob Barr for Signing Term Limits Pledge, Asks Loudermilk to Follow Suit

Palm Beach, FL – U.S. Term Limits (USTL), the leader in the national movement to limit terms for elected officials, today praised Georgia 11th District U.S. House candidate Bob Barr for signing the USTL congressional term limits pledge, while openly questioning why his opponent Barry Loudermilk has not done the same.

“Bob Barr has shown exceptional leadership by standing with 75 percent of the American people who support term limits on Congress,” said USTL President Philip Blumel. “Barry Loudermilk, who describes himself as a ‘stalwart for conservative issues,’ must now decide if he will back up that claim with action, or throw in his lot with lobbyists and Washington insiders.”

Blumel emphasized that term limits have near-universal support with citizens, and are only a controversial issue amongst members of the permanent political class.

“Gallup polling shows that term limits have huge majorities with Democrats, Republicans and Independents,” he said. “The one obstacle we face is elected politicians who refuse to listen to the people.”

The U.S. Term Limits Amendment Pledge is provided to every announced candidate for federal office. It reads, “I pledge that as a member of Congress I will cosponsor and vote for the U.S. Term Limits amendment of three (3) House terms and two (2) Senate terms and no longer limit.”

The U.S. Term Limits Constitutional Amendment has been introduced in both the U.S. Senate by Senator David Vitter (R-LA) and the House of Representatives by Representative Matt Salmon (R-AZ). The bills, SJ RES 2 and HJ RES 41, have 12 and 16 sponsors respectively.

The term limits amendment bills would require a two-thirds majority in the House and Senate, and ratification by 38 states in order to become part of the constitution.
