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U.S. Term Limits Praises GA-1 Candidates for Signing Term Limits Pledge, Asks Buddy Carter to Do Same

Palm Beach, FL – U.S. Term Limits (USTL), the leader in the national movement to limit terms for elected officials, today praised District 1 U.S. House candidates Bob Johnson, John McCallum, Jeff Chapman and Darwin Carter for signing the USTL congressional term limits pledge, while openly questioning why frontrunner Buddy Carter has not done the same.

“These four candidates have shown exceptional leadership by standing with 75 percent of the American people who support term limits on Congress,” said USTL President Philip Blumel. “Buddy Carter must now decide if he will join them in the fight to change Washington, or throw in his lot with lobbyists and professional politicians.”

Blumel emphasized that term limits have near-universal support with citizens, and are only a controversial issue amongst members of the permanent political class.

“Gallup polling shows that term limits have huge majorities with Democrats, Republicans and Independents,” he said. “the one obstacle we face is elected politicians who refuse to listen to the people.”

The U.S. Term Limits Amendment Pledge is provided to every announced candidate for federal office. It reads, “I pledge that as a member of Congress I will cosponsor and vote for the U.S. Term Limits amendment of three (3) House terms and two (2) Senate terms and no longer limit.”

The U.S. Term Limits Constitutional Amendment has been introduced in both the U.S. Senate by Senator David Vitter (R-LA) and the House of Representatives by Representative Matt Salmon (R-AZ).

The term limits amendment bills would require a two-thirds majority in the House and Senate, and ratification by 38 states in order to become part of the constitution.
