### **U.S. Term Limits Praises North Carolina's U.S. Senate Candidates for Signing Pledge, Asks Thom Tillis to Do Same**

Palm Beach, FL – U.S. Term Limits (USTL), the leader in the national movement to limit terms for elected officials, today praised North Carolina U.S. Senate candidates Heather Grant, Mark Harris and Edward Kryn for signing the USTL congressional term limits pledge, while openly questioning why Thom Tillis has not done the same.

“These three candidates have shown exceptional leadership by standing with 75 percent of the American people who support term limits on Congress,” said USTL President Philip Blumel. “Thom Tillis, who says he supports term limits, must now decide if he will back up that claim with action, or throw in his lot with lobbyists and professional politicians.”

Blumel emphasized that term limits have near-universal support with citizens, and are only a controversial issue amongst members of the permanent political class.

“Gallup polling shows that term limits have huge majorities with Democrats, Republicans and Independents,” he said. “the one obstacle we face is elected politicians who refuse to listen to the people.”

The U.S. Term Limits Amendment Pledge is provided to every announced candidate for federal office. It reads, “I pledge that as a member of Congress I will cosponsor and vote for the U.S. Term Limits amendment of three (3) House terms and two (2) Senate terms and no longer limit.”

The U.S. Term Limits Constitutional Amendment has been introduced in both the U.S. Senate by Senator David Vitter (R-LA) and the House of Representatives by Representative Matt Salmon (R-AZ).

The term limits amendment bills would require a two-thirds majority in the House and Senate, and ratification by 38 states in order to become part of the constitution.
