



## NORTH CAROLINA TERM LIMITS POLL: EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

US Term Limits survey conducted Dec. 9 through Dec. 15, 2022 by RMG Research Group.  
500 Registered Voters in NC participated in the survey.

**A large majority (74%) of North Carolina voters favor an amendment imposing term limits on Congress.** 70% of voters also say that they would approve of having North Carolina call for an amendment proposing convention to enact congressional terms limits. Additionally, 68% of voters state that they would be more likely to vote for a candidate for State Legislature who supports implementing term limits for members of Congress.

### Methodology

The survey of 500 Registered Voters was conducted for USTL on December 9-15. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by gender, age, and race.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 4.5 percentage points.
