



TX23 TERM LIMITS POLL: EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

US Term Limits Survey of 430 Likely Republican Primary Voters in TX23

Conducted by RMG Research, November 28-December 1, 2023

Survey Summary: The results of this recent poll in Texas’ 23rd Congressional District survey show that Republican Party likely voters overwhelmingly support term limits for members of Congress. Support for term limits is broad across all political and demographic groups. **An overwhelming 93% of the voters approve of an amendment to the U.S. Constitution that will place term limits on U.S. Senators and U.S. House Representatives.** Of the respondents who support term limits, 63% want 6-years total or less as the limit, and have also indicated that they are more likely to support congressional lawmakers who help advance congressional term limits.

Methodology

The survey of 430 Likely Republican Primary Texas' 23rd Congressional District Voters was conducted online for USTL on November 28-December 1, 2023. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by gender, age, and race. Likely voters were determined by a screening process within the survey.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 4.7 percentage points.
