



TX32 TERM LIMITS POLL: EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

US Term Limits Survey of 300 Likely Democratic Primary Voters in TX32

Conducted by RMG Research, November 13-16, 2023

Survey Summary: The results of this recent poll in Texas' 32nd Congressional District survey show that Democratic Party likely voters overwhelmingly support term limits for members of Congress. Support for term limits is broad across all political and demographic groups. **An overwhelming 86% of the voters approve of an amendment to the U.S. Constitution that will place term limits on U.S. Senators and U.S. House Representatives.** The respondents also indicated that they are more likely to support congressional lawmakers who help advance congressional term limits.

Methodology

The survey of 300 Likely Democratic Primary Texas' 32nd Congressional District Voters was conducted online for USTL on November 13-16, 2023. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by gender, age, and race. Likely voters were determined by a screening process within the survey.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 5.7 percentage points.
