

IL07 TERM LIMITS POLL: EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

US Term Limits Survey of 323 Likely Democratic Voters in Illinois' 7th Congressional District Conducted by RMG Research, November 28 - December 3, 2023

Survey Summary: The results of this Illinois' 7th Congressional District survey show that likely democratic voters overwhelmingly support term limits for members of Congress. Support for term limits is broad across all political and demographic groups. An overwhelming 79% of the voters favor an amendment to the U.S. Constitution that will place term limits on U.S. Senators and U.S. House Representatives.

Of the respondents who support term limits, 51% want 6-years total or less as the limit. They also indicated that they are more likely to support lawmakers who help advance congressional term limits. When the term limits stance of candidates is unknown, the incumbent, Danny Davis and his challenger, Melissa Conyears-Ervin, are heavily skewed. However, when it is revealed that Conyears-Ervin supports term limits while Davis does not, the incumbent drops 11 percentage points and the challenger gains 19%, catapulting to a 2% lead.

Methodology

This survey of 323 likely democratic voters in Illinois' 7th Congressional District was conducted online for USTL on November 28 - December 3, 2023. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by gender, age, and race. Likely voters were determined by a screening process within the survey.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 5.5 percentage points.
