



PENNSYLVANIA TERM LIMITS POLL: EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

US Term Limits survey conducted Jan 2-6, 2025 by RMG Research Group.
 509 Registered Voters in Pennsylvania participated in the survey.

A large majority (78%) of Pennsylvanian voters approve of placing term limits on Congress.

75% of voters favor having Pennsylvania call for an amendment proposing convention to enact congressional term limits. Additionally, 70% of voters state that they would be more likely to vote for a candidate for state legislature who supports implementing term limits for members of Congress.

Methodology

The survey of 509 registered Pennsylvania voters was conducted for USTL on January 2-6. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by gender, age, and race.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 4.3 percentage points.
